Preferred route picked for Lake Michigan water

Utility doing final inspections, expects route to be finalized by end of year

WAUKESHA Waukesha Water Utility has selected a preferred route for a roughly 15-mile pipeline expected to bring Lake Michigan water from the City of Milwaukee to Waukesha.

In letters sent Friday, the utility informed the mayors of Milwaukee, New Berlin, Greenfield and West Allis of the route choice.

Should it become a reality the preferred pipeline would run from 60th Street and Howard Avenue in Milwaukee, up West Honey Creek Drive to West Oklahoma Avenue, continuing west along Coffee Road and Racine Avenue in New Berlin where it would connect with the Waukesha Water Utility's water distribution system at Minooka

"Minooka Park is where we actually have our water storage and booster pump facility. Milwaukee will pump the water to that facility, and then we will take it from that facility, touch up any chemicals that need to be touched up, and pump it into our facilities," Waukesha Water Utility General Manager Daniel Duchniak said Monday.

The route essentially takes the pipeline through three cities, Milwaukee, West Allis and New Berlin.

"Greenfield won't be affected anymore, because we will be going through Milwaukee. We will be touching West Allis a little bit, but it is mainly Milwaukee and New Berlin that will be affected," Duchniak added.

Sears property redevelopment underway at Brookfield Square

BROOKFIELD — Three weeks have passed since Sears closed its longtime Brookfield Square store, and mall management say customers will soon begin noticing changes to the property's southeast side.

Three confirmed restaurant and entertainment destinations will soon take the place of Sears, a mainstay at the mall for more than half a century. A Mar-BistroPlex, first announced last summer, will occupy a portion of the property.

Also taking root at the site are two restaurant and entertainment options making their debuts in Wisconsin: WhirlyBall, a bar and restaurant offering such amenities as bumper cars, and Uncle Julio's, a Mexican eatery touting its use of fresh ingredients.

Investors sign letter of intent to buy Bon-Ton Stores

MILWAUKEE Although The Bon-Ton Stores was scheduled to go to bankruptcy auction on Monday, a group of investors stepped forward to express interest in buying the company and signed a letter of

intent to do so. On Friday, Bon-Ton, dual headquartered in Milwaukee and York, Pa., filed a notice with the Wisconsin Department of Workforce Development, indicating 2,255 employees across the state could lose their jobs

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

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




Trump Tower fire victim didn't have working smoke detector in his apartment

NEW YORK (AP) - Smoke detectors save lives — and one might have saved the man who died in Saturday's blaze in Trump Tower.

Todd Brassner's apartment didn't have a working smoke detector, FDNY officials said Monday.

Firefighters rushed over to the Fifth Avenue high-rise after a buildto the blaze, officials said.

By the time they arrived, Brassner, a 67-year-old art dealer, was unconscious on the 50th floor.

Brassner later died at the hospital from smoke inhalation, the city medical examiner said Monday.

It's likely the fire was accidental, sources said.

But investigators have yet to pin down what set the blaze, which spewed bright flames and smoke from several windows in the glasssheathed tower.

Property owners like Brassner are responsible for making sure they ing-wide alarm system alerted them have working smoke alarms, according to New York City law.

A lack of sprinklers in the tower's residential floors contributed to the fire, FDNY officials have

Facebook users still waiting on privacy scandal notices

The 87 million users who might have had their data shared with Cambridge Analytica were supposed to get a detailed message on their news feeds starting on Monday. Facebook says more than 70 million of the affected users are in the U.S., though there are over a million each in the Philippines, Indonesia and the U.K.

As of 3:30 p.m. Eastern Time, however, there were no signs that any users have yet received that notification or a more general one Facebook said it would direct to everyone on its service. Associated Press reporters around the world have been surveying users, none of whom have reported seeing anything from Facebook. There appear to be no social media reports of notifications, and Facebook had no immediate comment on the matter.

CEO Mark Zuckerberg acknowledged that he made a "huge mistake" in failing to take a broad enough view of what Facebook's responsibility is in the world. He's set to testify before Congress on Tuesday and Wednesday.

> In prepared remarks released by a House committee, Zuckerberg said the company has notified all users affected in the scandal. Since the remarks are for Wednesday morning, this means everyone who was affected should see a message by then.

> Cambridge Analytica whistleblower Christopher Wylie previously estimated that more than 50 million people were compromised by a personality quiz that collected data from users and their friends. In an interview aired Sunday on NBC's "Meet the Press," Wylie said the true number could be even larger than 87 million.

communities. "This isn't the final route. This is (the) preferred route, so now we go ahead and do all of the survey work that needs to be done. The route may change here and there. We may find there is some contamination that will cause problems, so we would need to adjust the route for that reason. However, we anticipate that it will be somewhere along this route."

The hope is that the route will be finalized some time this year.

After that the utility will begin the permitting process. Duchniak said the goal is to start construction on the pipeline in early in

Pump house

Waukesha aldermen voted in December to approve a 40-year contract for the purchase of Lake Michigan water from Milwaukee. The deal allows Wauke-

sha to draw up to 8.2 million gallons of Lake Michigan water per day.

As part of the water agreement Milwaukee will design, build, own and operate a water pumping station located somewhere between 60th and 76th streets, and West Howard and Oklahoma avenues, as well as two miles of new water main in the city that will branch off from an an existing underground main on 60th Street.

The pump house itself would be 40-by-60 feet in size and likely be located on property that is for sale or owned by the city of Milwankee.

The city of Milwaukee is still determining where the pump house will be located, Duchniak said, and its location could affect the final route for the pipeline.

Keating is a Stacev spokeswoman with CBL Properties, the Chattanooga, Tenn.-based firm that owns most of Brookfield Square, including the Sears site. In an interview with The Freeman, Keating confirmed Sears has vacated the site, and interior demolition work is underway. Sears Holdings Corp., the

Hoffman Estates, Ill.-based owners of the Sears and Kmart banners, confirmed in January it was holding a liquidation sale and leaving the premises. The two-and-ahalf-month closing sale wrapped up March 18.

"Demolition work has already begun at the Sears site," Keating said. "Inside prep work is already under-

In the weeks ahead, Keating said crews will begin tearing down most of the 160,000-square-foot structure to accommodate the new tenants. A firm date has not been set, but Keating indicated the site will start being barricaded to the public in early May.

CBL has not announced when the trio of confirmed eateries and entertainment destinations will open their doors, Keating said, though
