# Baldwin leads Vukmir in latest Marquette poll

Walker and Evers separated by a percentage

MILWAUKEE — The race for governor and U.S. senator are in the final stretch and Wednesday’s Marquette Law School Poll of Wisconsin shows incumbent Senate candidate Tammy Baldwin with a 10-percent lead over state Sen. Leah Vukmir.

The race for governor between incumbent Scott Walker and state Superintendent Tony Evers was much closer — the candidates just divided by a percentage.

Republican Walker had 47 percent support and Democratic gubernatorial challenger Evers had 46 percent support among likely voters. Libertarian candidate Phil Anderson received 5 percent. According to the poll, 1 percent of respondents said they lacked a preference or did not lean to a candidate. In the previous Marquette Law School Poll, in September,

among likely voters, Evers received 49 percent, Walker had 44 percent and Anderson had 6 percent. Likely voters are defined as those who say that they are certain to vote in the November election.

In comparison, the Senate race had a much greater margin between the candidates. Baldwin, the Democrat incumbent, leads among likely voters with 53 percent, while 43 percent support Vukmir, the Republican challenger, and 3 percent say that they lack a preference or do not lean toward a candidate. In the September poll, Baldwin received 53 percent and Vukmir was supported by 42 percent.

For Wisconsin attorney general, Republican incumbent Brad Schimel was out front with 47 percent of the

respondents saying they’d vote for him, while 43 percent said they’d vote for his Democratic challenger Josh Paul. The poll showed that 10 percent of likely voters lack a preference in this race. In September, Schimel held 48 percent and Kaul 41 percent of likely voters.

Among all registered voters surveyed in the poll, Walker receives 47 percent, with Evers at 43 percent and Anderson with 7 percent.

In the Senate race, among all registered voters, Baldwin receives 53 percent and Vukmir 42 percent. For attorney general, registered voters give Schimel 45 percent and Kaul 41 percent.

The poll was conducted Oct. 3 to Oct. 7 and the sample included 1,000 registered voters in Wisconsin interviewed by cellphone or landline, with a margin of error of +/- 3.6 percentage points. For likely voters, the sample size is 799 and the margin of error is +/- 3.9 percentage points.

# Public hearing on Clean Water Plant facilities plan set for Nov. 8

WAUKESHA — The city of Waukesha will hold a public hearing on the amended facilities plan for its Clean Water Plant at 5:30 p.m. on Nov. 8 at City Hall, 201 Delafield St., during a Board of Public Works meeting.

An amended facilities plan was submitted in 2011 to the state Department of Natural Resources, and was the basis for recent plant improvements, a city press release states. The plan was further amended in 2013 for the inclusion of a return

flow pumping station, pipe line, and outfall to receive Lake Michigan drinking water. Serving as another amendment in 2017, a “Final Compliance Alternatives Plan” was submitted to the DNR related to phosphorus permit compliance. An updated amendment to the facilities plan relating to refinement of the return flow pump station, return flow pipe line, phosphorus treatment, and improvements at the return flow discharge site was then

submitted to the DNR in August 2018.

The public hearing on Nov. 8 will cover the 2018 plan amendments.
